May Meeting Report

Minutes—OCS Meeting, May 18, 2019, at Moreland Presbyterian Church

Present: Denis Dooley, Chris Dooley, Shelley Hannan, Joe Hannan, Irene Lewis, Brady Sheets, Pat Sheets, Grace Bayley, Susan Haywood, Greg Anderson, Kathy Lintault, Roger Lintault, Collier Brown, Martha Ragland, Alan Taft.

Delicious ice cream and treats were provided by Collier and Martha, Grace, Kathy and Roger, and Brady and Pat.

A special welcome was given to new member Irene Lewis.

Denis asked Greg if he were interested in becoming a camellia judge. Denis added that there would be a judging school in the near future since a number of us need to renew as judges. Members can come to the judging school to just investigate if they might be interested.

Denis is now a Club Director on the ACS board—one of three from the West Coast.

Martha presented Treasury report—\$6830.77 in checking at the end of April 2019.

Camellia sale at the Newberg Camellia Festival—\$1337. OCS had paid \$450 for 100 plants sold at the sale and \$150 to the Chehalem Cultural Center for tables.

Grace offered to be the new representative to the Pioneer District, Oregon State Federation of Garden Clubs. Alan will be her back-up. Shortly after the meeting, Shelley said she'd also be happy to help with the Pioneer District.

Denis will submit a slate for past due elections. *Editors note: We are currently in need of 2019-2022 directors to replace expired terms of Ann Rasmussen and Jack Campbell.*

Chris moved that in the future, planning for annual OCS camellia meetings and events be part of a board meeting rather than a general members' meeting. The motion was passed. *Editors note: Traditionally the boards planning meeting has been in October as the bylaws do not require a meeting that month. Other months without required meetings are June, August, and December.*

Brady made a motion to form a propagation committee. It was passed. Brady is putting together an 18 x 40' shade structure where camellias can develop after cuttings have been potted up. Cuttings could be rooted by Van Veen Nursery. Collier suggested that OCS could help with the cost of the shade cloth. Brady will gather information about it. Denis suggested a work party to help Brady. Joe mentioned that the state of Oregon has given away greenhouses to high schools. A greenhouse could be donated to a high school in Hillsboro if we wanted to coordinate with the students there.

A propagation committee was formed—Brady, Greg, Susan, Shelley, Chris, Collier, Alan, and Kathy.

Martha made a motion to again donate \$250 to Pioneer District, Oregon State Federation of Garden Clubs, for its scholarship program. The motion passed.

Planning Ideas for 2019-2020

Susan would like to see how camellias are planted at other members' houses. Alan added that this would be a good time to show how to prune and care for camellias.

Camellia show at Newberg Camellia Festival—April 18, 2020. (Easter falls on the prior weekend.)

Camellia show at Portland Japanese Garden—March 28-29, 2020. It was discussed whether this show should be only one day because of the work involved, but Collier felt it was worth the two-day effort. Chris suggested we don't need to do quite as much on Sunday—maybe Garland need not hold people's judging on Sunday. Grace offered that we had a lot of success advertising the Newberg Camellia Festival at the Japanese Garden show.

Brady offered his home for a September meeting about grapes.

Denis suggested inviting Jim or Tom Nuccio to speak in January 2021. One is an alumnus of University of Portland. Joe offered you could contact University of Portland's alumni association, try to get a write-up in the university magazine, etc. Kathy will contact Portland Chapter, American Rhododendron Society, to see if they might be interested in having J/T Nuccio speak also. Then both clubs would share expenses.

Collier was interested in again visiting the Home Orchard Society at Clackamas Community College in the fall.

Kathy would ask Bud Bowen if OCS could visit Ainsworth House again in January or February. She also mentioned some planning ideas that had been offered at the January 2019 meeting such as slide shows offered
