Horticulture Schedule

Division I Camellia japonica Protected/Unprotected

Class 1 One bloom, small &
medium - 2 1/2" to 4"

Class 2 One bloom, large & very
large - over 4"

Division II Retics/Hybrids Protected/Unprotected

Class 1 Retic. and Retic. Hybrids
One bloom - all sizes

Class 2 Non-Reticulata Hybrids
One bloom - all sizes

Division III Sprays One spray 5"
to 18"

Division IV Boutonnieres Protected/Unprotected

One bloom 2 1/2" or less - All
species

Division V All Other Species Unprotected

Division VI Trays of Blooms Unprotected

Class 1 Three matched blooms of
the same variety

Class 2 Five blooms of any or a
single variety

Division VII Seedlings, Mutants, or Sports

Division VIII Fragrant Blooms

One fragrant bloom per variety -
all sizes

Exhibition Rules

Horticulture Division

1. Exhibitors need not be
members of the Sponsoring
Camellia Society.

2. The Spray Division will
constitute the display of one
Camellia spray or branch, with
flowers and foliage; stems should
not be less than 5" or more than
18" in length from the top of the
vase. Exhibitors may enter more
than one spray but entries must be
of different varieties.

3. The judging will be by
accredited ACS judges in

accordance with ACS Rules &
Regulations, revised July 2017.

4. Entries will be accepted from
8:00 a.m. to 10 a.m. Saturday. The
show will be open to the public
Saturday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

5. Exhibitors are responsible for
the placement of blooms.
Inexperienced exhibitors should
seek assistance from society
members at the show information
table. All entries must be in
accordance with the schedule.

6. Entry cards will be furnished and
will be available prior to the show.
*Nomenclature of the Southern
California Camellia Society* or the
Nomenclature Supplement will be
used as the standards for all
varieties.

7. The Show Chairman shall have
the authority to withhold from
competition unworthy specimens
or improperly entered blooms.

8. Judges, clerks, and the Show
Chairman should not be distracted
in the exhibition area during
judging prior to the official
opening of the show.

9. The decisions of the judges shall
be final.

10. All blooms entered in Divisions
I through VIII must be from
plants that have been in the
possession of the exhibitor for at
least three months.

11. All competitive entries shall be
single blooms attached to their
stems, and must have one or two
leaves. Wiring of any bloom to its
own stem is encouraged. The leaf
or leaves must be from the same
variety, but may be from a
different plant.

12. An exhibitor is limited to one
entry of a variety in any class
except Division VI, Trays of
Blooms, and Division VII,
Seedlings and Mutants. Any

number of blooms from a seedling may be entered.

13. Judges shall disqualify themselves while their exhibits are being judged, if possible.

14. No one may touch or move a bloom on display except clerks or the head judge.

15. Exhibits will be dismantled by 5:00 p.m. on Saturday.

16. All ribbons, certificates, and trophies not claimed by 5:00 p.m. Saturday, or at the next Camellia Society meeting by pre-arrangement will be forfeited.

17. Division IV - Boutonnieres is open to blooms of all species. These blooms may be displayed in small bottles/vases if too small for condiment cups.

Horticulture Awards Ribbons will be awarded in each competitive class where flower quality warrants (BLUE for first, RED for second, and YELLOW for third) and Oregon Camellia Society Certificates will be presented when appropriate. A prize will be awarded for the BEST OF SHOW. Gold and Silver sweepstakes will be awarded for all bloom entries. Crystal or other comparable items of recognition will be awarded to winners in the award categories listed next. Only one award will be given to a particular entry.

Entry Instructions

Entry cards will be available at the information table at the show. If you need assistance, please ask someone at the information table at the show.

ENTRY TAG BLANKS REQUIRED
Above the perforation, members and nonmembers fill in VARIETY, DIVISION, CLASS NO, and NAME.

Below the perforation fill in DIVISION and NAME. Also, we ask that nonmembers fill in ADDRESS.

THE VARIETY BLANK

Use the variety name specified in the *Nomenclature Book of the Southern California Camellia Society (S.C.C.S)*. Older varieties are in the *Camellia Nomenclature Supplement*, 1996 edition. Copies of the nomenclature books will be available at the information table at the show. To find the name to use, look up the variety by the name you know it by. If the flower is described there, use that name. Otherwise, use the name you are referred to.

THE DIVISION BLANK

This show program identifies the divisions and their classes under the heading "Horticulture Schedule."

THE CLASS BLANK

For Division I, the class is determined by size. The nomenclature book will identify the size of the blooms of each variety. The nomenclature book classifies size by miniature (Division IV), small and medium (Division I, Class 1), and large and very large (Division I, Class 2). For Division II, the class is determined by whether the variety is in the Reticulata or Reticulata Hybrid section of the nomenclature book (Class 1) or is in the Non-Reticulata Hybrids section (Class 2).
