The society gathered for the presentation and taping of a seminar on beginning camellia culture in the tent at Chehalem Glenn Golf Course in Newberg.

The presentations were

101 Planting camellias in the ground presented by Garland

102 Watering and fertilizing in ground camellias by Collier & Garland. Collier discussed how he does it in a standard home lot, Garland discussed how Kathy did it in a three acre forest lot with a drip irrigation system in place, and Garland discussed how he does it in a forest lot with no local water source.

103 Pruning smaller camellia trees presented by Garland

104 Air-layering a live potted plant presented by Brady who put an air layer on a live potted New Moon Rising, which is Oregon originated and chosen by the American Camellia Society as the representative of the single flower form in their latest show judging handbook.

105-205 Rooting cuttings and potting up presented by Christie

107 Propagation by grafting presented by Garland

Unfortunately, we did not have 106 Growing camellias from seeds by Susan as we asked her to do it at a time when she was out of seeds to plant.

Chris Goldstein video recorded the event and we are anxious to see what segments will be of a quality that we can present in public at future shows.
