Also, OCS will be selling camellias that it has propagated—a bonus for any of us looking for that special camellia.

February Meeting Report

February 18, 2017

Brady moved and Roger seconded that an "edited" newsletter will be posted each time for public viewing to the new website. Edited will remove members' contact and location information when they appear in the newsletter. Motion carried. Denis volunteered to be nominating committee chair, with Garland and Chris to serve with him. Since we are not having an official April meeting, it was decided we would vote and install officers at the May meeting.

Martha talked about the convention arrangements. She is writing a grant proposal to get hotel tax funds for convention expenses. The board approved up to \$500 in funds for the hospitality suite to go into the grant proposal. A FYI should be sent to local Garden Clubs for the Friday lunch. During the flower show, Bryan will provide ropes and signs to limit access to the judging area of the show. They will go up at 10 am for clerks work, and will stay up until after judging, which begins at 11, completes. Garland is to provide Bryan with a diagram for show tables and preparation areas. Major exhibitors will have a preparation area in the show area to alleviate the need to come through the doors and foyer with prepped blooms. Den will do a camellia education event for kids at the Camellia Festival, and Garland is to provide cabbages for the event. As the show program is

already published, we will be adding a spray division to next year's schedule. Chris is to obtain and provide an example of such a division to Garland. There will be no formal fragrance requirement for fragrant blooms as all that is required is for the nomenclature to designate so. Individual judges are responsible for their own ranking of such flowers. Consideration of judges' apparel was put off for a future show when only our usual judges will be judging.

Bryan will be going to Fort Bragg, CA to get a new camellia introduction to be named after either Newberg or Chehalem.

January Meeting Report

January 21, 2017

Dick and Karen Cavender presented a fascinating report on their trip to the International Camellia Conference in China.

In the business meeting, Roger moved and Collier seconded that we fund \$12.08 monthly to Wix for our new website. Motion carried. Two ideas were presented to add a March meeting to the schedule.
