### Japanese Garden

The Oregon Camellia Society held its show at the Japanese Garden over the weekend where the public votes for their favorite flowers, which turns into awards for the best formal double, best rose form double, best semi double, best anemone, best peony, and best single form camellias.

A favorite was selected from each flower form for both Saturday and Sunday, culminating with a run-off vote Sunday afternoon to choose the winner of the award.

In the anemone class, Saturday winner Bob's Tinsie entered by G Bayley beat Sunday winner Candy Mint entered by Kathy and Roger Lintault by 21 to 12.

In the single class, Saturday winner Ohkan entered by Beth Little slipped by Sunday winner Ohkan entered by Collier Brown by 17 to 16.

In the peony class, Sunday winner Debbie entered by G Bayley knocked out Dr. Clifford Parks entered by Collier Brown 24 to 10.

In the semi-double class, Sunday winner Herme entered by G Bayley edged out Saturday winner Haru no utena entered by Martha Ragland 16 to 15.

In the rose form double class, Sunday winner Lady Laura entered by G Bayley was victorious over Saturday winner Lemon Drop entered by Kathy and Roger Lintault 18 to 16.

In the formal double class, Saturday winner Sawada's Dream entered by Martha Ragland swamped Sunday winner Ella Ward Parsons entered by Collier Brown by 32 to 2.
